

## Celebrating our grandparents

- Covid 19 has been a difficult time for older people. Many of you have not seen your grandparents for some time, so now we are asking you to write a poem to celebrate their role in your life.

#### Brainstorm



Write down all the things that come into mind when you think about your grandparent



Consider all the things they do for you. Don't forget the presents!



Write a list of their hobbies.



Include their favourite foods.



Think about their personality traits-perhaps they are very kind, or forgetful or brave or silly.



Consider all the knowledge they have passed onto you.

## Write a first draft of your poem



Use your ideas in your brainstorm to write your poem



Include adjectives, 'My Grandad Mick is tall and strong.'



Include similes -remember a simile is a comparison of two things and contains the words 'as' or 'like' —e. g ' My granny is as fit as a gazelle.'



Poems do not have to rhyme.



Each line of the poem starts with a capital letter.
Use the fewest words in the best possible order.
For example, 'Tall with purple glasses,
She peers out the window'
